Hagley Primary School Governors

Governors and Senior Leaders continue to work hard to develop the 2 areas highlighted in the July 2022 Ofsted inspection.

Much work has been undertaken to develop the school Curriculum even further so that children are thinking like Scientists, and Historians, using an enquiry based approach to their learning. Book looks this term are showing the impact of the staff meetings and Continuing Professional Development held during the Autumn Term. The children are developing their skills as Scientists and Historians etc, as well as developing key knowledge and vocabulary in order to answer their “Key Question”, at the end of each topic.

SEND continues to be a significant focus for the Senior Leaders, teaching staff and support staff this year. Significant training and support has been provided to teaching staff and support staff this academic year and learning walks have focused on ensuring that all SEND children are well supported, and are able to succeed. Results of continual assessments show that SEND children make progress against their own targets, due to the many interventions that they receive but Senior Leaders are reflecting on how many interventions each SEND child is undertaking and how that is impacting on their time in classroom learning the wider curriculum.

Senior Leaders & Governors are committed to developing these important areas alongside the other school priorities, and are proud of the staff’s commitment and determination to continually improve and develop.

This term Governors have again spent time in school undertaking a variety of roles: monitoring Maths

(including Girls Maths, Challenge as well as support for SEND) across the school with the Senior Leaders; reviewing First Aid Processes; observing and talking to children at lunchtimes; speaking to groups of children about their feeling of safety in school, and on the internet and have run Film Club, as well as attending: Committee meetings (Leadership & Management, Quality Of Education, Resources, Personnel, Pay & Performance); meeting with Phase leaders & Senior Leaders (Safeguarding, SEND & Data); Working Groups (Well Being and Equality, Diversity and Inclusion) and a Full Governing Body meeting .



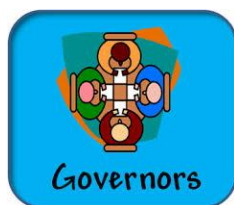
Governors are extremely proud of the amazing opportunities that Hagley Primary school children have to take part and experience a variety of sports as well, as represent their
