Attendance and Punctuality

We have really enjoyed saying a big **WELCOME BACK** to our Year 1 – 6 pupils and saying a big **HELLO** to our new pupils in Reception over the last few weeks. It has been wonderful to see the children settle back into the school routine with their friends and new class teacher.

With that in mind, we are focused on ensuring every pupil has the best possible attendance they can to make the most of their learning and social time. We understand that children may not always be well enough to attend school everyday, but we feel it is important to share with you that everyday counts and we would appreciate children being in school everyday unless they are unwell. The Attendance Ladder on the left shows how the loss of school days affects

children's attendance figures over the course of an academic year.

We discuss the importance of punctuality with our pupils regularly. Being on time each day is vital. The first part of the day is very important for your child(ren) to settle into their school day and for their class teacher to share what is planned for the day. So, arriving late can be very unsettling for children. Our registers open at 8.40am and close at 9.00am and pupils arriving after 9.05am will receive a late

This does not mean your child(ren) must have perfect attendance, but we will celebrate children who achieve 99% over the course of a half term. 
